The Franklin Youth Football League is committed to establishing an environment that is safe and fosters optimal learning opportunities for Coaches, Parents and Players. Football plays an important role in promoting the physical, social, and emotional development of young players who can recognize choices, think about consequences and base their actions on that information. Therefore, it is essential for parents, coaches and spectators to encourage youth athletes to embrace the values of good sportsmanship. Furthermore, parents, coaches and spectators involved in football events should be models of good sportsmanship and should lead by example by:

Parent Code of Conduct:

- Encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all players, cheerleaders, coaches and officials at every game and practice.
- Support your team and the coach refrain from excessive “sideline coaching” from the stands. Remain under control during games in order to set a good example for players and other spectators.
- Refrain from using profanity and tobacco products at all times.
- Abide by a doctor’s decision in all matters of players health and injuries for practice and games.
- Accept the decisions of officials on the field as being fair and called to the best ability of the officials.
- Do not criticize an opposing team, its players, fans, coaches or team by words or gestures.
- Support the coaches, players and officials and help teach the value of commitment to the teams, sportsmanship, ethical conduct and fair play.
- During games if you volunteer to assist yard and first down chain crew refrain from rooting for a particular team, commenting to officials or coaches and focus on your assistance to the officials and chain crew.
- Any inappropriate behavior is cause for immediate ejection from the sidelines or stands. Repeat offenses can result in being barred from future practices, games and FYFL sponsored activities.
